Charlie Kirk Died: A Turning Point ~ by Pastor Chris Pretorius

We used to say that martyrdom didn't really happen in the west. We might face increasing opposition to our beliefs, but Christian persecution is pretty minor in countries like ours. Today Charlie Kirk, founder of Turning Point USA, was shot dead. I have seen the footage. There was a lot of blood. But as Tertullian famously said "The blood of the martyrs is the seed of the church".

Some of us, myself included, woke up to this news this morning shocked and dismayed. Charlie was one of the most effective and helpful Christians of our age. He spoke rationally, Christianly, and in a God honouring manner. He was a committed father of two young children, loving husband to his wife, and a strong proponent of biblical Christian values. He rightly believed and preached that abortion is wrong, that it is perhaps the single biggest evil in our time, that it results in the masse murder of children to the tune of millions each year.

For this he was constantly attacked. He stood up against liberal leftist views and spent a large portion of his time openly debating people in public. During these debates he would put forward a rational and logical view and invited others to poke holes in his arguments.

Very few, if any, succeeded at that. At the same time he allowed others to freely express their opinions and would then challenge them on the aspects of their worldviews that were in conflict or irrational. For this he endured abuse and, at times, assault. He stood up for historical views that society has held as given for hundreds of years. These "radical" views include that there are only two genders, that men and women are different, that it is good for men and women to have children, that it is immoral to murder unborn children, that people should take responsibility for who they have sex with, and that the problem with the world was not primarily "out there" but "in here". He actively opposed transgenderism as an evil which forces people to participate in, affirm and champion a lie they know to be untrue.

He did these things because he was a Christian who loved Jesus. He was a patriot who loved his country. He was a rational debater who loved people enough to challenge them on beliefs that harm themselves and the world. I do not agree with his view that gun ownership is a good thing, but He did not force anyone to accept his views. Instead he tried to convince people through rational argument. He let rational common-sense thought dictate what he believed, and publicly invited others to do the same.

I believe that that is why he was shot. No, not shot, martyred. Killed for promoting a world in which Christ ruled. Assassinated for fighting for a world ordered the way the Creator did. He died as a victim of a spiritual war. A victim of the fight for the very soul of countries like the USA and Australia that were built on a Christian foundation. He died after being shot, while openly and publicly inviting debate in his "Prove me wrong" booth at Utah Valley University. But today Channel 9 (Australia) reported "Protrump personality Charlie kirk dead after shooting on US college campus".

BBC reported that "Trump ally shot dead at campus event". ABC (Australia) ran a piece titled "Who was Charlie Kirk, the MAGA podcaster and Trump ally shot dead in Utah?". While this may be media shorthand, it goes to show that these media outlets have fundamentally misunderstood what Charlie Kirk stood for.

Charlie Kirk was assassinated, not because he supported Trump. He was martyred because he fought, peacefully, for a world aligned with the design of God. A world where people weren't forced to participate in lies. A world in which the courage to speak the truth would be applauded instead of ridiculed. R.F. Kennedy Jr. said it well:

"Once again, a bullet has silenced the most eloquent truth teller of an era."

But perhaps the one who said it best was Jesus himself: "Well done, good and faithful servant... Enter into the joy of your master."



Before he met Jesus, Guo was overwhelmed with the subliminal message that the church was the bride of communism. Sheng, a co-worker, invited him to attend a local, official church. As Guo walked into the building, he read the words on the sign at the entrance: "Love This Country, Love Our Religion, Honour God, Benefit People." Inside, the pastor preached a sermon called Being a Patriotic Christian. Guo sat amidst so-called 'patriotic Christians' who listened as the pastor declared that "the church is a member under the Party's leadership" and "faith should integrate with communism".

The members, in obedience, responded in unison with "Amen". For Guo, this initially seemed correct. But Guo wasn't listening with the discerning ears of a regenerate believer, but with the ears of an aspiring 'good citizen' of China

Guo was, in his pursuits, a good citizen of China: attending the official church, trying to pray and learning some of their songs. He even began to find a sense of belonging in the church. However, the external striving failed to quell the internal tempest. The sermons left him unsatisfied and unquenched. Furthermore, he had questions: "What is true faith?", "Why do the pastor's sermons always emphasise the country and the [communist] Party?", "Isn't faith supposed to be a personal inner experience, a choice in life's path, a pursuit of eternal values?" It wasn't until a year later that Jesus calmed the internal storm. Guo's employer sent him to another city to pursue a marketing development opportunity.

When in this new city, and away from the official church, he met a woman - his neighbour - who enthusiastically invited him to attend her church, described as a "small gathering". Guo was hesitant. He had heard of house churches and underground churches and knew they weren't officially recognised. His pastor had dismissed these churches as places where "heresy ran rampant". But Guo felt he couldn't refuse, and so he went.

What Guo encountered was, to him, strange. It was a place without the typical markers of the official church: no pulpit, ornate decorations, or officially recognised pastor. Instead, Guo witnessed a dozen people in a circle with a few Bibles and hymn books. In the service, a brother shared from Scripture about how Jesus was "the way, the truth and the life". It was in this brother's sharing that Guo discovered that one comes to God simply and only through Jesus. He is at the centre of the Christian faith - He alone. Not any other religion or organisation or isms. Only Jesus. "That was the first time I heard the true gospel," said Guo. For the first time, he heard the unpolluted, undiluted, uncorrupted gospel. He found the true Bridegroom for the church.

Fast forward a few months, Guo, now a true sheep, was baptised. With time, it became evident that the official church he once belonged to was fundamentally a bride of communism, not Christ. When a brother lent him a copy of Wurmbrand's Tortured for Christ, he read about how the official church was in the business of uprooting religion. A year later, Guo returned to his own city a changed man. He became a passionate evangelist and started a small Bible study group. With time, some of his friends from the official church came to the study and eventually came to faith, to the displeasure of the official church leaders. Guo received a call from the official church pastor, who accused him of "sheep stealing". The leader said, "You took away our members, disrupting the church's unity. This is immoral! Moreover, your activities outside the official church are all illegal."

Guo came to understand that true sheep follow Jesus only. He reflects, "Before we truly understood the gospel and wholeheartedly trusted in Jesus alone and followed Jesus only, we weren't even Jesus' sheep. At that time, although I had the title of Christian, I was merely a registered religious person in the official church. At that time, we obeyed the Party's policies. I didn't have the confidence to know that Jesus would say to me: 'I know My sheep, and My sheep listen to My voice'." Guo continues to follow the truth, having true peace and joy as he commits to listening to the voice of the true Shepherd.
