Amazing Grace ~ Rosie Moore

"Amazing grace, how sweet the sound that saved a wretch like me!" John Newton, once a slave trader, understood his sinful wretchedness and penned these words. During a violent storm in 1748, he cried out to God for mercy. His dramatic conversion on the high seas transformed him into a faithful gospel preacher and abolitionist.

Newton knew he didn't choose God–God's grace reached out and rescued him. He knew that apart from God's grace, he would not have even seen the horror of his sin. As Colossians 2:11 says, our hearts are spiritually circumcised not by human effort, but by God's grace.

One of my greatest blessings was growing up with parents who lived and taught us the gospel of grace from when I was born. They named our farm and our hotels "Grace," and our BnBs still bear that name today, because everything is due to grace. Grace shaped everything in our home. My parents urged me and my siblings to show grace to each other in our differences, and the sweet fruit of our bond is stronger than ever today. It was foundational to our identity—not based on performance or feelings, but on God's undeserved love for us.

Salvation is entirely by grace—God's unearned favour. Faith is a divine gift of grace, not something we generate. Like Lydia in Acts 16:14, if you're a believer, it's because the Lord opened your heart to receive the gospel. Grace isn't earned by doing religious rituals or good deeds, or through virtue signalling. It's God's free gift so no one can boast. Grace is our refuge when we feel defined by sin, weakness, or failure. In fact, God's grace is sufficient and perfected in our weakness (2 Corinthians 12:9). We can approach the throne of grace with confidence and receive grace upon grace (Hebrews 4:16; John 1:16).

But God's grace not only saves—it trains us to live holy lives and to say no to ungodliness (Titus 2:11-12). We cannot continue to live in habitual sin if we have received God's grace. "No one born of God makes a practice of sinning, because God's seed abides in him, and he cannot keep on sinning, because he has been born of God" (1 John 3:9). There is a time when we need to question someone's salvation (or perhaps our own) if there is no evidence of the fruits of conversion.

We don't have to earn God's love. We're accepted in Christ. But this radically changes our behaviour and how we relate to others: Because of God's grace, we can forgive, love, serve, and speak truth with courage—not from fear or a need for approval, but from our secure identity as saints in Christ. We can love people more, and need them less.


Living as a Chosen Saint

So how do we live as chosen saints?
Rest in God's grace rather than striving to earn it.
Reflect Christ's love, knowing our identity is secure.
Pursue holiness, living in line with our true identity.

Prayer:

Father, thank You that I am chosen, holy, blameless, and beloved in Christ. Thank you that I am saved by grace alone, through faith in Christ alone. Thank you for choosing me and calling me to yourself through the gospel. Thank you for sending someone to share the gospel with me and for giving me a soft heart to receive it.

Thank you for planting the seed that gave me new life in Christ. Help me live out this identity daily, reflecting Your love and grace to those around me. Bring those you have ordained for eternal life across my path, so that I may share the gospel with them. Remind me that my security is in Christ alone, and empower me to live a holy and bold life for Christ.




Over 30 Christians were beheaded in a series of recent attacks in northern Mozambique by Islamic State-affiliated terrorists who also released graphic photographs showing executions, shootings and widespread arson. The group targeted multiple villages across Cabo Delgado and Nampula provinces, setting fire to churches and homes in a campaign of violence against civilians. The Islamic State Mozambique Province, or ISMP, released a 20-image photoset this week, documenting its operatives' executing civilians by beheading and close-range gunfire, and burning down homes and churches, MEMRI (Middle East Media Research Institute) reported. The group claimed responsibility for several attacks throughout the last week of September, including beheading of two Christians in Chiure-Velho, Chiure District. ISMP operatives also claimed responsibility for the raid on Nacocha village in Chiure District, where a Christian was shot and killed, and two churches were burned. The same day, they attacked Nacussa village, also in Chiure, and set fire to two more churches.

Fighters also raided Macomia Town, killing four Christians and looting their belongings before withdrawing without casualties, according to ISMP's statement. ISMP said its operatives had beheaded a Christian in Macomia District. The following day, the group reported an assault on Nakioto village in Nampula Province's Mimba District, burning over 100 Christians' homes and one church. In nearby Minhanha village, in Memba District, they reportedly destroyed one church and 10 homes. The group said its militants returned to their bases after torching the Christians' homes.

The Defence Post report quoted one resident as saying that gunmen entered the neighbourhood around 8 p.m., killing four and kidnapping four others, including a woman and her two daughters. Another said a young man was shot dead after refusing to surrender his father's belongings. The violence is part of an escalation that has displaced tens of thousands of civilians and prompted a renewed security alliance between Mozambique and Rwanda, according to ADF magazine.

ISMP reportedly conducted attacks across six districts in September, from Balama in the southwest to Mocímboa da Praia in the north, according to the Armed Conflict Location & Event Data Project. In a rare assault on Mocímboa da Praia on September 7, fighters reportedly moved door to door identifying victims. This marked only the second such attack on the town since September 2021. ISM had previously launched simultaneous attacks in northern and southern Cabo Delgado in July, with 60 fighters entering Ancuabe and Chiure districts unopposed.
